SCHOOL

Sugar Salem High School is a four-year public school with roughly 540 students in grades 9 through 12. The school graduated its first senior class in 1909. Sugar-Salem High School is accredited by Northwest Association of Accredited Schools.

CURRICULUM

The academic program is organized on a 3 trimester schedule. Five credits per trimester is the maximum course load, with a total of fifteen per school year; students take five 72 minute courses daily for each trimester.

One credit hour = 71.25 seat hours per credit

COLLEGE ENTRANCE EXAMS

All students are given the opportunity to take the ACT and SAT at Sugar-Salem High School.

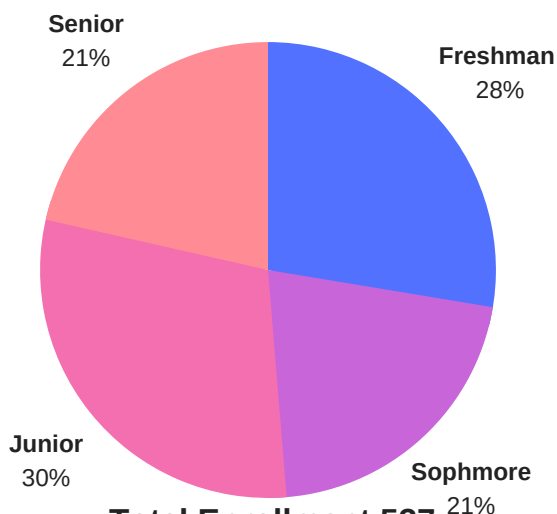

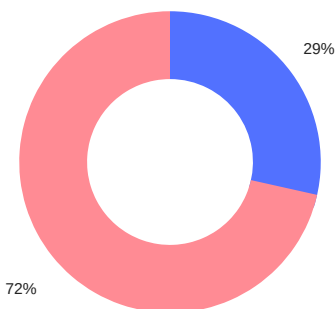
AP® COURSES

Students can register for dual credit courses beginning their sophomore year of high school. Students must have a cumulative 3.0 GPA in order to register for dual credit courses.
